Department of Boating & Waterways Delivers New Floating Restrooms to Lake Elsinore

In support of protecting water quality and providing convenient restroom facilities for the boating public, the California Department of Boating and Waterways is providing the City of Lake Elsinore with two new Floating Restrooms to replace two older models from 2002. The Floating Restrooms are being delivered next Wednesday, May 8th at the La Laguna Resort & Boat Launch (32040 Riverside Drive, Lake Elsinore, 92530).

The Floating Restrooms have been appropriately dubbed as SS Relief Stations No. 1 & 2. Mayor Magee states...“these upgraded Floating Restrooms will continue to satisfy an urgent public need for people on the go”.

Pat Kilroy, Director of the Lake Department, notes that although the Floating Restrooms are an amusing sight to behold they actually are a very important amenity for the southwest side of the Lake, as no public restroom facilities are readily available. Given that Lake Elsinore is the largest natural freshwater lake in So-Cal it's a welcome relief to boaters to see these facilities on the water.

The Floating Restrooms are uniquely designed and only use the highest quality construction material for durability and public safety. The double hull waste containment system ensures the protection of water quality. City Staff performs maintenance on the restrooms several times per week during the boating season and weekly tows the Relief Stations to shore for pump-out.

Dennis Waite, Lake Maintenance Staff, said “for those of us privy to the construction & operation, I'm impressed with these high tech floating water closets”.
